

For Everyone's Enjoyment

- Pets must be under the immediate supervision & control of owner at all times. Pets must be leashed on Mountain Bike Trails and sections of trails that are on private property.
- Pet owners are required to pick up after pets.
- Do not alter the trails in any way. Stay on designated open trails.
- No motorized vehicles. Electric bikes permitted with pedal assist engaged.
- Ride bikes under control at all times. Be a good neighbor.
- All other users must yield to bikers on designated Mountain Bike Trails. Bikers yield to other users on all other trails.
- Trails are open dawn to dusk unless otherwise posted or during special events.
- Use of trails is at your own risk.
- Glass containers are prohibited.
- No camping or fires.
- Leave no trace. Pick up after yourself and others.
- Treat the environment, trails, and signage with respect.
- Alcoholic beverages, smoking & vaping, illegal drugs, firearms, weapons, and illegal activity is prohibited.
- Report any illegal activity to Milton Police Department. Report downed trees and trail damage to Milton Recreation & Parks.



Activities

The Bombardier Park Trail System can be used for dozens of outdoor recreation activities! Examples include walking & running, biking, snowshoeing & cross-country skiing, birdwatching & wildlife viewing, photography, meditation & forest bathing, dog walking, orienteering and geocaching.



The following uses are NOT permitted: Motorized Vehicles, Horses, Fires, Smoking, Camping, Glass Containers, Alcohol, and any other prohibitions found in the Parks & Recreation Ordinance.
